- His Greatest Recognition is he is the only American to win two Olympic Marathon Medals

- He was next to last person to see Olympian Steve Prefontaine alive!
- Shorter's character was prominently featured in the 1998 film Without Limits!
- Inducted into the US Olympic Hall of Fame 1984
- Inducted USA National Track & Field Hall of Fame 1989
- Co-Founded the Memorial Day Bolder Boulder 10K in Colorado 1979
- A Life-Sized Bronze Statue of Frank Shorter is at the BB10K finish
- In his hometown Middletown NY a street bears his name "Frank Shorter Way"
- Graduated Yale University 1969; University of Florida Law School 1974
- Yale University new "banked" Indoor Track named after Frank Shorter
- October 2011 Runner's World story: "Shorter is dedicated to stopping cycles of violence in the home"
- USA Anti-Doping Agency Chairman 2002 and 2003, a body he helped establish
- He is recognized as the "Father of the Modern Running Boom"
